- Strengthen the relationship between health professionals and patients.
- Improve the quality of and personalize therapeutic paths.
- Promote well-being and reduce stress among healthcare personnel.

The event also aims to enhance the involvement of cultural heritage, promoting collaboration between the health sector, museums and humanities sectors to develop educational programs with medical and nursing schools and other sectors related to health promotion and care. The goal is to facilitate continued training, deepening awareness of the topic and integrating these activities into clinical practice.
